



Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe- November 22 & 23, 2025



**Christ Our King: The Reign of Love** 

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This weekend, we celebrate the **Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**, which marks the end of our Church year. Pope Pius XI established this feast in 1926 to remind the world that Christ alone is King and that true peace and justice flow only from His rule over our

hearts and lives.

When we picture Christ the King, we may imagine him crowned with gold and glory. Yet we also see another powerful image—the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Though Jesus did not walk this earth with his heart visible, he carried a heart burning with love for us. The image of his Sacred Heart reminds us that his kingship is one of compassion, mercy, and sacrifice.

Earthly kings often expect their people to give their lives in defense of crown and country. But our King reversed that pattern: he gave his own life for his people. His kingdom is not built on power or conquest, but on love that gives itself completely.

Christ's Kingship is unlike any other. He was anointed by the Father as the Eternal Priest and Universal King. As Priest, he offered his life on the Cross for our redemption. As King, he reigns over all creation, presenting to the Father a kingdom founded on truth, justice, peace, love, and holiness.

To acknowledge Jesus as King means allowing him to reign in our hearts, our homes, and our world. When we consecrate ourselves and our families to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we proclaim him as Lord of our lives. Many who have enthroned the Sacred Heart in their homes experience transformation—greater unity, peace, and love within their families.

Often, our faith becomes private—each person praying alone. But when a family gathers around the image of the Sacred Heart, something beautiful happens: walls begin to fall, hearts are united, and Christ takes his rightful place at the center of family life.

Each Sunday, as we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, we renew our commitment to live under Christ's reign. When we are sent forth with the words, "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord," we are reminded to live throughout the week as citizens of his Kingdom—doing his will, spreading his truth, and sharing his love. As we honor Christ our King today, let us thank him for the suffering and humiliation he accepted for our sake. Whatever sacrifices our faith asks of us are small compared with the price he paid for our salvation. Let us be faithful and grateful subjects of this loving King, members of his kingdom on earth, and heirs of the everlasting kingdom he has prepared for us in heaven.

The couple should contact the priest as soon as they become engaged. They must meet with the priest twice before setting a marriage date. These two meetings need to be completed 6 months before the proposed date.



### November 23, 2025 Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run. I felt as if I

was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all.

I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). That word — remember — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of his Body. And Jesus says, "Today you will be with me in paradise."

He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, "You will be with me."

That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love.

What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with him — paradise begins even today.
